#### **EPHESIANS - LIFE GROUP STUDY GUIDE**

For the remainder of 2025 we will be preaching through the book of Ephesians. During this series we encourage you to follow along with the sermons by leading your life group in the Discovery Bible Study (DBS) method.

## Why are we doing a DBS?

We believe DBS is one of several key elements we want to equip our Life Groups in as we pursue the vision of making 10,000 disciples in ten years. We believe a crucial element in making disciples who can make disciples, is people knowing God's word. Training people in the DBS is a skill they can easily transfer to others.

Part of what makes DBS so valuable is the "discovery" of what a text is saying. We will be studying the passage during the week *before* the passage is preached on to discover as a group what the text is saying and how it can be applied first. Then hear a sermon on the passage on Sunday. You may then like to begin your next meeting with a recap of what else you learned in the sermon.

The ideal passage length for a DBS is 5–6 verses. Some of the preaching passages are longer or shorter than this, so use your judgement on 5–6 key verses within the preaching passage to lead your group in a DBS.

A guide on how to lead a DBS follows the passages we will be looking at.

# Leading a DBS

There are five main steps in the DBS method:

- 1. One person reads the passage out loud.
- 2. Everyone reads the passage 1-2 times silently to themselves.
- 3. Everyone closes their bible and as a group try to repeat as much of the passage as you can together.
  - Note: focus on trying to just repeat what was read, this isn't the step to ask questions, summarise the meaning or unpack the application.
- 4. Open bibles and read the passage again, noting any parts that the group didn't remember.
- 5. Facilitate a time of discussion using <u>some</u> of these suggested questions:
  - What stood out to you?
  - What questions do you have?
  - What does this passage teach us about God's nature?
  - If you had to pick the most important/central verse, what would it be?
  - How would you summarise the central message of this passage?
  - Did God say anything to you personally out of this passage?
  - What can you apply from this passage?

The strength of this method is that it provides time for the group to become familiar with the passage before discussing it and helps them remember what they studied afterwards.

#### Guidelines for conversation:

- Try to stick to the passage. Discourage people from cross-referencing and going to other parts of the bible.
- It is simpler if everyone is reading from the same bible translation, but not critical.
- Try to discourage people from reading out any study notes in their bible. These are great for private study but tend to shut down group discussion and bypass the process of 'discovery'.
- A good facilitator will NOT do most of the talking but 'facilitate' the 'discovery' process for the group members. Good facilitation takes practice!
- You don't have to know all the answers. Always see if the group can answer hard questions. Simply be honest when you don't know and ask a bible teacher later that week.

### Preparing to lead a DBS:

Although a DBS is simple to lead, it is still vital to prepare as a facilitator and have an idea of where you would like the discussion to go. Preparation might include:

- Learning the context of the passage who wrote it, when, where, why?
- What are the difficult or confusing parts of the passage?
- What is the big idea of the passage?
- Pray and think about what the applications could be.
